




A New Doctor in Ukraine

LIUDMYLA'S CHILDHOOD STRUGGLES FUELED HER DETERMINATION TO SUCCEED

Liudmyla was just 10 years old when her mother passed away from cancer. Her father struggled with the situation and remarried, leaving Liudmyla in the care of her aging grandmother, who was very poor and suffered from diabetes. She often couldn't afford to heat their home during the cold Ukrainian winter. In 2002, when Liudmyla was 11, she entered the Chalice sponsorship program.

Pochaiv site director Halyna Mykytuik says it was wonderful to see Liudmyla's growth. Mykytuik says she had a special interest in Biology, wrote essays and participated in science conferences. Thanks to the support of her sponsors, Liudmyla is now a doctor working at a cardiologic dispensary near the city of Kiev. She has a good salary and can afford to rent a safe place to live. With her first pay she purchased a glucose meter for her diabetic grandmother who had cared for her all those years. Every month she also sends money for diabetes medication. Liudmyla thanks Chalice and her sponsor for helping her earn an education and lifting her from poverty.

Through her years of sponsorship, Liudmyla exchanged many letters with her sponsor. Words can comfort, heal, motivate and brighten children's lives. Many children would not have pursued a career if not for the encouragement of their sponsor. Communication with sponsors and the examples they set have a strong effect on family bonding. Your support is precious, but your letters are priceless.

SOPHIA'S SPONSORS INSPIRED HER TO HELP OTHERS



Seeking employment, Sophia's family migrated from Goa to Mumbai, India. At the time Sophia was sponsored, her parents were making and selling snacks to earn an income.

Sophia was sponsored through Chalice for almost 13 years. With her sponsor's help, she graduated this year with a Bachelor of Education degree and is now working as a teacher.

"I am thankful to God for my sponsor and Chalice family; because of you I have achieved my goal. I learned how to share as you have taught me. Chalice is my inspiration and I love to help others. I pray and desire for every child in our country to get an opportunity to study and bring changes to the nation. As a teacher, I will make a difference in the lives of my students."

Thanks to our generous supporters, **3,331** new sponsorships were gained this year.


99% of sponsored children are in school.

DE PAUL SCHOOL THANKFUL FOR NEW WELL



“May God continue to bless each and every one of you in this great work of sharing the love of Christ,” says sponsor site director, Father Binoy Puthussery.

The Mbangamao community in Tanzania had a list of items they wished to receive through Chalice’s Christmas Gift Catalogue. A borehole well for the De Paul School topped the list. Their previous water source was mountain-top dependent and pipes would often break, leading to a lack of water for the school.

“By God’s grace everything went well and now De Paul School has a well, with a source of fresh water,” Father Binoy expressed.

He says the borehole machine was transported from 1000 km away in Dar es Salaam, which was expensive, making the gift a true blessing from Chalice supporters. When the well was finished and the water gushed out, many of the **400 students** and a number of community members, shouted for joy.

Haiti Poultry Cooperative

POULTRY CO-OP BRINGS SUSTAINABILITY



The villages of Terrier Rouge and Grand Bassin in northern Haiti are home to nearly **1450 Chalice sponsored children**. The country of Haiti faces many challenges such as its levels of underdevelopment and poverty, and the frequency of natural disasters. Thanks to our supporters' generosity, the site is able to provide access to quality education, health care and nutritional support.

Chalice contracted International Sustainable Community Assistance (ISCA), a non-profit organization, to develop a plan to create jobs and livelihood options in Terrier Rouge and Grand Bassin. Several agricultural projects were considered, and ISCA recommended poultry production and a local food processing enterprise as these were deemed to have a high probability of success.

During the first year of a two-year program, poultry vaccination clinics were conducted and a community poultry cooperative was established. This was followed by construction of **17 chicken coops**, selection and training of the families involved in the poultry enterprise and the hiring of a Community Livelihoods Officer and Veterinary Agent. Further training in small business management was provided and a poultry market study was conducted in preparation for the establishment of an egg laying barn and chick hatchery in year two. In the second year of the program an additional **17 chicken coops** were built, an agro-feed store was opened, as well as the full establishment of a chick hatchery for the cooperative.

Chalice's **Projects** help families and communities by providing facilities and opportunities that they would otherwise be unable to access.

CRITICAL NEEDS FUNDING PROVIDES SUCCESSFUL SURGERY

Critical Needs

are identified on a case-by-case basis and can vary from emergency surgery and medical treatments to emergency housing needs.



This fiscal year, Chalice provided **34** individuals with **Critical Needs Funding** to help with medical

emergencies, home emergencies, and other critical needs. Funding was also provided to **one sponsor site** (Cotabato) in the Philippines, where food was provided during a period of drought.

Jannlex was only four months old when his 17-year-old mother and his grandmother brought him to the Tondo Site (Manila) in the Philippines. Staff at our site referred him to a neurosurgeon, who diagnosed him with lumbosacral myelomeningocele (a type of spina bifida) and congenital hydrocephalus (build-up of excess cerebrospinal fluid in the brain at birth). The doctor recommended immediate surgery to correct the defect at the base of the spine and also that a shunt and tubing be inserted for drainage of excess fluid on the brain. Following the successful surgery, Jannlex's mother wrote, "I am very thankful for the assistance you gave to make the surgery of Jannlex possible. If not for you, my child may not be here today, his condition was very delicate. Thanks to the surgery, he is now one year and one month old. He is playful and naughty. He is healthy and he knows how to kiss the hands when prompted. I really thank you for your help. May God bless you and fill your cup to the brim and overflowing."

Funding Replaces Belongings Lost in Fire

SPONSORED CHILD MATIAS AND HIS FAMILY IN CHILE ARE GRATEFUL FOR CHALICE'S SUPPORT

Matias' family was devastated when fire destroyed their home and belongings. Chalice donors helped the family by replacing some of the items they lost.

Helping Families Rebuild

RELIEF EFFORTS CONTINUE FOLLOWING TYPHOON HAIYAN



Chalice continues relief efforts following one of the most powerful tropical storms ever recorded, Typhoon Haiyan. Construction has begun on **130 housing units** in Basey, located on the island of Samar. The foundations have been completed for the first **76 homes** and **30 houses** have already been completed.

Families began moving in at the end of February 2016. Through jobs created by the project and families housed, there will be more than **1300 people helped** through the support of Chalice donors.

As a former rice field, the project site was vulnerable to flooding, rendering it inaccessible for work during the rainy period from July through early October. Given these wet conditions, the municipality focused on adding drainage infrastructure to prepare the land for building.

The Chalice project is the first government/private sector/non-government organization/community-led partnership to begin construction of permanent homes for families displaced by Typhoon Haiyan.

Hope is Hand Delivered

DISASTER RELIEF FUNDING HELPS FAMILIES IN GUATEMALA



On October 2, 2015 a landslide, triggered by heavy rain, struck the community of El Cambray. Over 100 homes were buried and hundreds lost their lives. Aid and search efforts began immediately. Local people offered support with food, clothing, and temporary shelters.

With generous support from our sponsors, Chalice was able to provide **30 families** with food, shelter, hygiene products and other needs.

One family says the tragedy changed them forever. Margarita says the worst was seeing her house disappear under the dirt. She and her two children survived. They recall the earth shaking and the entire community disappearing under a veil of dust. Her mother, three brothers, brother-in-law and four nephews all disappeared in the rubble. Margarita writes, "We do not know you, but we know that you have sent us your help. May God bless you all today and always."

Chalice mission trips are a great way for people to visit their sponsored children, and share their talents to help where needed. This year, five successful trips brought together


55 volunteers who helped **83 children and elderly** find sponsors and raised **\$125,980** to help communities become stronger and more self-sufficient.

A mission trip is a life-changing experience. Many people return to Canada eager to become Chalice Champions. These volunteers speak about Chalice in their parishes, organize fundraising events, share their experiences, and spread the word about the work we do.

Virland, a volunteer participant with the mission to Kenya says, "It's the most wonderful holistic experience, because you're learning from the people you are helping, from the staff at the site, and from the members on your team. You receive so much love and joy and always want to give more."

Hospitality Highlights Trip

WARM WELCOME DELIGHTS UKRAINE MISSION PARTICIPANTS



The mission team of **17 volunteers** from across Canada created a bond with each other and those they met in Ukraine. The moment they stepped off the plane they were met with warm hugs from staff and children. Little did they know an old friend to Chalice was waiting in the crowd. Volodia, a 29-year-old professional, husband, and father was the first child to be sponsored at the Lviv Site in 1999. He is the perfect example of what sponsorship helps children achieve.

"Everyone was eager to share and learn from their experiences and learning new strategies brought hope for all of us!" Mission Trips Coordinator Joanne recalls. The participants of the addiction training have already started small groups to tackle addiction in their communities. Each participant in the first aid training received a donated first aid kit.

The team met children who are sponsored by team members or their family and friends. "One visit I will always remember. The social worker from the site led us to a home where we know two children were still waiting for sponsorship," remembers Joanne. "We were all so surprised to see the family inside! The mother had participated in the addiction training, seeking help to understand the disease that divided her family, and two of the older boys had worked with our team at the school and had played soccer with us. It really felt like we were visiting our extended family."

Healthy Minds and Bodies

NUTRITION PROGRAM IMPROVES HEALTH, SCHOOL PERFORMANCE



The elderly caring for the very young is common in Mikinduri, Kenya. Diseases like malaria, typhoid, and HIV/AIDS have resulted in the death of many parents.

With Chalice funds, a nutritious feeding program is now in place at the local elementary school. This is enabling families to produce some of their own food, as well as supplying food for the school feeding program.

The school feeding has improved the attendance of children in school and enrollment has increased **48%**. There are now **1400 children** enrolled at the school.

Chalice continues to support proper nutrition in various parts of Africa. The program contributes to an improvement in children's development and participation in school. Efforts have also resulted in improved overall performance.

The **Chalice Children Nutrition Program** began in Latin America, and this year expanded into Africa. Future plans include expansion to the Philippines and Haiti.

PROPER NUTRITION RESULTS IN WEIGHT GAIN, GROWTH AND IMPROVED ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

Malnutrition and hunger are major problems threatening the health and development of children in many countries. Our partners in Peru, Bolivia, Guatemala, and Paraguay are providing nutritious home-cooked lunches to a number of sponsored and non-sponsored children.

This year:

- **1637** children and seniors have been fed by this program in Latin America
- **584** children in Bolivia received multivitamins
- **687** children have been dewormed
- **176,472** meals were served in Latin America

The result of this improved nutrition is a measurable gain in both weight and growth of the participating children.

Our Chalice Children Nutrition Program has made a positive impact on many children including several children that have been treated for severe malnutrition at the Luis Amigo Nutritional Centre at our site in Guatemala.



Direct Family Funding in India and Bangladesh

AN INCREASED SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY HELPS MEMBERS BETTER MEET THE NEEDS OF THEIR CHILDREN

Using the Direct Family Funding (DFF) approach, introduced in 2011 at the Imphal Site in India, sponsorship funds received for children and their families are transferred to the bank accounts of parents/guardians of the children.

To facilitate the DFF process and ensure accountability, Community Circle Groups (CCG's) of 15-20 members are formed, comprised of parents/guardians of sponsored children. The CCG's hold regularly scheduled meetings to manage the funds and determine how the money will be spent.

DFF promotes the participation of parents and guardians in the decision-making process with regard to the development of their children and family, and builds capacities towards sustainable development and self-reliance.

Sponsorship funds are used for specific purposes, such as children's education, health, nutrition and family development. There has been an increase in the sense of responsibility and accountability among members. Many are now saving for the future needs of their children.

Over the past four years (2013-2016), based on these successful outcomes, Direct Family Funding has been implemented in all of Chalice's sponsor sites in India and Bangladesh, and there are currently **625 community circle groups** functioning in the region.






Revenues 2015-2016




Expenses 2015-2016
