



## **Nutrition**

A little boy from Dominica Sponsor Site in Paraguay (pictured above) enjoys his meal. The site's focus is on improving nutrition of the children.

Five communities within the site's service receive support from soup kitchens, which provide a meal to about one thousand children each day. For many of those children it is their only complete meal.

Nutrition is one of the primary focuses of the sponsorship programme. When a child is properly fed they will be able to focus better at school; nutrition is in many ways the fundamental starting point to affecting change.

#### **Education**

In India great strides are being taken in the education system and the importance of being exposed to technology at an early age has been recognized. At schools run by our sponsor site partners, computers are being introduced in the classroom. Through the support of Chalice programmes many computers and desks have been provided. For some children it is the very first time they have sat in front of a computer. While our primary role is working with families and communities to ensure that their children have life's basics like water, food and medical care, this is not where it ends. We also support our children and teens in attaining a wellrounded education and these days, wherever you go, this includes developing technical skills and linking into the worldwide web.

## Health

An important focus of the sponsorship programme is improving the health of sponsored children and their families by instilling good health practices. At the Pochaiv Site in Ukraine one approach is teaching proper hand washing techniques to improve personal hygiene. Children who learn how to properly wash their hands pass this knowledge on at home to their families. Through working with local schools and child care facilities many workshops have been delivered and washroom facilities have been improved.

# **Special Children**

Chalice continues to expand sponsorship to those most in need, including children with special needs. St. Odilia, the newest sub site of Kawambwa Site in Zambia, provides care and schooling for the visually impaired.

The Sisters of the Child Jesus continue to teach the children the core curriculum in addition to promoting self-esteem and dignity for all, regardless of their impairment. Through sensitization the Sisters are fostering a community that welcomes and celebrates all abilities.







# **Community Building**

Parent groups are common in sponsor sites from all regions. In India they are called Self-Help Groups. When mothers of sponsored children approach site leaders for specific kinds of assistance, they are encouraged to work with other parents who have similar needs through the Self-Help Groups, creating them where needed. Many groups undertake income generating projects such as animal rearing and vegetable cultivation. Each group has its own guidelines around income generated and how it is divided between the group and individual member's savings. For many people this is the first time they have opened a bank account and is another step toward autonomy and identity. The Self-Help Groups also serve as a forum for sharing and gathering information.

# **Faith and Prayers**

Jamesley is a sponsored child in the Haiti South Site. He was born with a spinal cord deformation and is unable to walk. His doctor recommended that he see an orthopedic surgeon. During the earthquake of 2010 the hospital in Port-au-Prince was destroyed, preventing him from meeting the surgeon. Jamesley's father was one of thousands of casualties of that devastating event.

Jamesley radiates the love of Christ through his smile and kindness to all who cross his path. During a visit last June, Jamesley touched the heart of a Chalice supporter, who has helped to get his treatment back on track. Faith has sustained his family through incredible challenges. While his father will not be there to hug him after surgery, God willing, he will be smiling down from heaven as a witness to the love of Christ through the healing hands of the medical team. Every year Chalice helps many children around the world who have special medical needs, like Jamesley, to receive the treatment and support they require.

The communities of La Ladrillera and Huaca de Chacupe Alto, served by the Chiclayo Site in Peru, now have access to clean, safe water as a result of the installation of three water taps. Access to clean water is a key component to overall improved health. The community is receiving educational workshops about the proper use of water for consumption and for personal hygiene. The taps are located in areas close to the families' homes, making the task of fetching water safer and less time consuming. (*Picture right*)

The opening of the Girls' Hostel at DePaul Secondary School was the final step in providing equal access to quality secondary education for disadvantaged girls from villages surrounding Mbangamao, Tanzania. The Girls' Hostel can accommodate up to 200 girls and provides a safe and secure space for boarding, study, prayer and play. The hostel also houses an infirmary, which provides care to the girls when needed. In partnership with Chalice, this Community Project was managed by the Vincentian Fathers, who direct the Mbinga Site sponsorship programme. (Picture below)




#### **2014 REVENUES**


