Serve Child Centre-Wadeaf Sponsor Site operates under two systems. There is the Distribution Model for children in St Don-Bosco and Wadeaf Special Schools for the mentally challenged and deaf children respectively. Then the Direct Family Funding (DFF) program for the normal children from needy families from the surrounding communities and deaf children in senior high schools and in tertiary learning institutions. The main areas emphasized in this report include education, health & hygiene, nutrition, community, family and direct family funding/ circle groups.

EDUCATION



Achievements

1. All our children who completed their junior high school education were able to proceed to the senior high schools
2. Sponsored children in St Don-Bosco and Wa school for the deaf were supplied with learning materials during the period.
3. School dropout rate has been reduced drastically during the period under review.

Goals

1. Continuous education of both parents and children to reduce school dropout rate to its barest minimum.
2. To guide and support at least five normal and two deaf children to be able to complete their senior high school and successfully join the tertiary level of education.

HEALTH/HYGIENE:



Achievement

1. Provided sponsored children at St Don-Bosco and Wa school for the deaf with tooth paste, tooth brushes, soap and disinfectants over the period.
2. Collaborated with Agamal Ghana limited to spray homes of our sponsored communities with mosquito insecticides.
3. Supplied children at St Don-Bosco with

epileptics' drugs and other related drugs to reduce the level of infection.

Goals

1. Register/renewal of health insurance cards for sponsored children in Wadeaf and St Don Bosco special schools and also advice the normal children and their parents to do so.
2. Support the mentally challenged children with medication (drugs)

NUTRITION

Achievement

1. Supplementary feeding to Wadeaf and St Don-Bosco Special schools throughout the period.
2. The Chalice children nutrition fund was a great catalyst that solved most of the nutritional needs of the two special schools.
3. Some needy aged and orphanage home were supported with foodstuffs during Christmas.



Goals

1. Continue to support Wa school for the deaf and St Don-Bosco with supplementary feeding.
2. Support parent groups with tractor services and fertilizer to grow more food that will enable food security.

COMMUNITY

Achievement

1. Successfully provided the catering department of Wa school for the deaf with equipment which now help the children train in bread making and other general catering services
2. Community Hall/office successfully in its second phase of construction
3. We were able to bring all the five executive members of all the parent groups together to share business ideas and experiences

Goals

1. To complete the ongoing community hall/office for FC groups meetings.
2. Drill a borehole and establish a mango plantation for St Don-Bosco Special School

FAMILY

Achievement

1. Individual parents were encouraged to start their businesses which are yielding positive results as part of the economic empowerment process.
2. Families are proud of having and managing their own accounts and businesses
3. With the support of the Site, individuals have bought building materials using DFF and other funds and put up their own houses

Goals

1. Support families with fertilizer to increase farm yield thereby reducing poverty
2. Support families to save at least Ghc 500.00 per year.

DIRECT FAMILY FUNDING/FAITH CIRCLE GROUPS

Achievement

1. The three Chalice Sites have successfully jointly established a credit union where all sponsored parents are shareholders
2. Both individual sponsored parents and groups are becoming economically empowered to start their own businesses through the credit union.
3. The Site office is now a marketing point for both St Don-Bosco and Wadeaf special schools for their enrolment of more special children through the circle groups spreading news of the vulnerable children in their communities

Goals

1. To support all the parent groups to put up group farms and other small scale businesses to increase their groups' finances
2. To assist more of the deaf and mentally challenged children in more vocational training programs like, beads making, bread baking, weaving, tailoring, carpentry and block laying and concreting.
