



ANNUAL REPORT 2018: HAITI SOUTH

The Haiti South Site works in five different areas: Carrefour-Sanon, Prévilé, Jérémie, Roseaux, Latibolière. We work with children in primary school and young people in high school and we support parent groups to come together for better monitoring. What interests us the most is to help them out of the economic slump and emancipate on the educational level, most of them are very vulnerable and evolve in extreme poverty.

EDUCATION

About 90% of the children are very concerned about their studies and their record could testify.

We have four female science students we have been supporting for four years who will be graduating very soon.

We have two young people who are at ESMI HQ University in Jérémie now, Jean Vanel Labranche of Roseaux and Wildy Joseph de Latibolière.

Goals

Continue to support children through the schools that are in greatest need across our sub sites where we work.

Have many more sponsored children for our Site.

Have scholarships annually in each area where we work to encourage children after graduation.

MEDICAL ATTENTION

Our Site supports the medical expenses for Jamsley Charles and Simon Marco who are two sponsored children, but who are in a critical situation. They need our help because their parents are very concerned about their health. We help others to fulfill medical prescriptions, especially those who are not able to do so. They come to us always for special requests or to pay for their schooling. But our focus is for children who are sponsored, who have medical emergencies and deserve in-depth care. 366,957.14 HTG, were spent for medical follow-ups, health care, drug purchase, school fees for children who are not sponsored.

Goals

- We want to continue to support people in difficulty.
- Help find a solution to their often deplorable situation of health.



NUTRITION

- The nutrition program supported by Chalice continues to make people happy.
- Parents are very happy to see children enjoy a hot meal each day.
- Children will be able to stay awake more to take classes.
School leaders are also very happy to have benefited from such a program, it helps their institution to be frequented by local residents. It's always good for schools to have a canteen program in their school.
- More than two thousand children have benefited from a hot dish, sponsored children and not sponsored.

Goals

- Continue to support schools that are part of the sponsorship program
- Feed the children
- Ensure that food is accessible to all children.
- Monitor that cooking is done in good conditions and that children can serve with respect.
- Continue to supervise the children's meal, the menu and the frequency with which they receive food.

FAMILY CIRCLES

54 parent groups are organized through our five sub sites, they are grouped into small groups and coordination for each sub site.

Each group committee for a day to make a meeting for the month

They make their contribution at each meeting

Among the parent groups, those of Prévilé is ahead of the other groups.

Prévilé groups make interest loans for their members. 45 people lend 2,500.00 HTG and the coordinating committee manages the cashier's group very well. Each group has the ultimate responsibility for giving their dues report to the coordination.

Goals

Continue to work with other groups to put them on the same level with Prévilé groups.

Framing the committees of each group to include chapel chalice in each group so that we can create a dynamic prayer within each group.


DIRECT FAMILY FINANCING (DFF)

So far our DFF system works well. Our bank booklets are stored at the central office. We have just delivered the Roseaux and Prévilé booklets in their respective Site. Parents can receive their bank book in the office of Roseaux and Prévilé, they do not need to go to the central office in Jérémie.

We are dealing with two banking institutions, Unibank SA and CAPAJ, we asked the parents who open their account at Unibank SA to have another person to open the account for the child, these new account opened at Unibank requires two signatures from the heads of the sponsored child.

Every time a parent comes to pick up his bank book, we ask them to submit a budget to get access to the bank.
