Mombasa site Mombasa, Kenya



Chalice has worked in Mombasa since 2001, partnering with the Sisters of St. Joseph. The site is situated on the outskirts of this coastal city, where the city's poorest families live. The site focuses on orphans, vulnerable children, widows, single parent families, and those infected or affected by HIV/AIDS. The parents and guardians of sponsored children receive micro-finance and financial literacy training, as well as sessions on good hygiene practices, sanitation, nutrition, and parenting. The site works with the parents to promote livelihood improvement through small business development.

Child



- 97.3 % (651) of Mombasa site's sponsored children are enrolled in school.
- 95.8 % (641 children) are registered in public schools at primary, secondary and post-secondary levels.
- 1.5% (10) sponsored children have a disability, and are enrolled in primary schools with appropriate programming.
- Mombasa site also supports 5 sponsored children with disabilities who are unable to attend school with nutrition, medical care and hygiene products.

Family

- Families of sponsored children used their sponsorship funds on food and rent throughout the pandemic shutdown.
- Through Chalice's COVID disaster relief fund, Mombasa site was able to distribute more funds to families to buy food.



Community

- Chalice's COVID-19 disaster relief fund enabled Mombasa site to buy food to support vulnerable children in 4 Children Homes. With the supplies the homes fed 328 children for a period of 3 months. The site also provided clothing and beddings for the children.
- They provided St. Mary's primary school with 2 water tanks, 160 desks and 11 teacher's chairs.
- The water tanks provided clean and safe water for drinking and hand washing to 1000 children and their teachers; the desks allowed children in kindergarten and grades 1-4 to keep safe distance while in class.
- At Mwachome primary school, the site partitioned one classroom to create office space for the school headmistress and her deputy and provided 13 chairs and 2 tables for the teachers.
